 - anyone in your family,
 - anyone in your school or
 - anyone in the community.

School Risk Management

- At St Mary's you have the right to feel safe and be protected from unsafe behaviours.

 - We should tell an adult if we see a risk
 - The school will try to protect you from a threat



School Code of Conduct

- To make sure you feel safe and are protected from unsafe behaviours St Mary's has a Code of Conduct.
 - This outlines the behaviours that school staff, volunteers and workers need to show.
 - You can find this code on the school website or at the office.



School Employment

• At St Mary's staff must be suitable to work with children. All staff are checked before and (teachers, during...) employment to find out...

- If they have a criminal record
- What their last job was
- That they have a Working with Children check
- Read and sign the school's Child Safety Code of Conduct
- Make sure they are nice to children
- Make sure they follow the rules
- Give them a trial to see if they are a good fit for St Mary's
- Once they have been at St Mary's for a while they will get more information about training and Child Safety
